SUBJECT: Consideration and Adoption of Resolution Approving the

Master Fee Schedule Effective January 1, 2024

PREPARED BY: Steve Wong, Finance Director

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Council conduct a public hearing on proposed amendments to the City's Master Fee Schedule, and upon closing the public hearing, consider adoption of a resolution approving the Master Fee Schedule effective January 1, 2024.

Background/Discussion

A municipality is authorized to establish reasonable fees for services rendered, provided that those fees do not exceed the estimated reasonable cost of providing the service for which the fee is charged. The City of Wheatland has established fees by authority of the Municipal Code, City ordinances, resolutions, development/funding agreements, and State and Federal statute.

In government, the difference between a fee and a tax is that a fee is paid by an individual for a specific good or service rendered by the government that benefits only that individual, while a tax has only a general connection to the benefits received for an individual.

The attached Master Fee Schedule ("Schedule") is being proposed to set fees in place as of January 1, 2024. Building fees and garbage fees are not included in the fee schedule since those fees are set by contract with Yuba County and Recology respectively. The fees listed for water and sewer service reflect the current fee structure and will be updated if the City Council approves recommended adjustments in 2024. The Master Fee Schedule is posted on the City's website.

FEES AUTOMATICALLY INCREASED

Certain fees are automatically adjusted each year based on either the change in the consumer price index (CPI) or the change in the engineering news record construction cost index (ENR). The attached resolution identifies user fees proposed to be in effect on January 1, 2024 and directs staff to adjust the following fees on the dates indicated per previously adopted resolutions and ordinances:

- FOG (fats, oil, grease) fee (Jan 1, 2024)
- Fire Protection Facilities fee (Jan 1, 2024)
- Impact fees (Jan 1, 2024)

- Planning and Engineering fees (Jan 1, 2024)
- Sign fees (Jan 1, 2024)

While there was authorization to automatically increase FOG and sign fees on July 1, 2023, the fee increase was deferred until January 1, 2024 so that all user fees are adjusted on a consistent schedule...

FEES UPDATED AS NEEDED

Other fees are updated as needed to ensure that fees charged are sufficient to recover the cost of services provided. These fees include Administrative, Business License, Cannabis Registration, Code Enforcement, Nuisance Abatement, Community Center and Park Rental, and Special Event fees. The Planning and Engineering fees administrative cost of "plus 20%" has been reduced to "plus 10%" to more properly reflect actual costs.

Copy fees are increased to \$2.00 for the first page and \$.25 per page thereafter (currently \$1.00 for the first page and \$.10 per page thereafter).

The Community Center room and kitchen fees were combined and increased by approximately 10%, the last adjustment to these fees was in 2018. Effectively restricting use of the kitchen when the kitchen facilities are not rented while the rest of the Center is rented has been a problem.

Park fees have been simplified to one event charge including restroom availability, instead of charging by size or location of the park and having to decide on the restrooms being open or not.

Police fees were also adjusted to more closely match the cost of services provided, also not having been increased since 2018. When a police report is requested to be copied to a flash drive, an additional \$5.00 charge is added (no change to the basic \$10.00 charge for a copy of a Police report). The Vehicle Release fee is increased from \$125.00 to \$200.00. Minor fees for VIN verification and mechanical citation sign-off have been eliminated as these services have historically been provided at no charge. A \$20.00 fingerprinting fee, hard card only, is established. A concealed weapon permit fee is eliminated as this service is provided by Yuba County. A local background check fee of \$25.00 is established.

The chart below is a summary of City fees and the method for adjusting the fees.

Fiscal Impact

Adjusting the City's user fees will result in additional revenue which will recover a portion of the cost of providing specialized services.

RESOLUTION NO. 39-23

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHEATLAND APPROVING THE MASTER FEE SCHEDULE EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2024

WHEREAS, a municipality is authorized to establish reasonable fees for services rendered, provided that those fees do not exceed the estimated reasonable cost of providing the service for which the fee is charged (Government Code Sections 66000-66018.5); and

WHEREAS, in addition to fees and charges identified in the City's Municipal Code, the City Council of the City of Wheatland has adopted Ordinances 339, 384, 400, and 448; Resolutions 10-93, 33-01, 38-03, 18-04, 39-04, 43-04, 28-05, 01-07, 07-07, 06-08, 21-09 06-10, 16-10, 15-12, 01-13, 04-19, 09-19, 10-19, 17-21, 25-20, 35-21, and 30-22; and development agreements, all of which establish fees for services rendered by the City, including administration, planning, building, business license, code enforcement, public works, park and recreation, public safety, water, sewer, and development impact fees; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City to modify the previously adopted fees to ensure that fees charged are reasonably related to the estimated cost of providing the service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Wheatland as follows:

- 1. <u>Fee Schedule</u>. The fees for administration, planning, building, business license, code enforcement, public works, park and recreation, public safety, water, sewer, and development impact fees are those set forth in the City of Wheatland Master Fee Schedule attached as Attachment 1 herein.
- 2. <u>January 1, 2024 Updates</u>. The Master Fee Schedule shall be updated on January 1, 2024 to reflect adjustments to Fire Protection Facilities, Impact Fees, and Planning and Engineering Fees based on Resolutions 01-07, 06-08, 15-12, and Ordinances 400 and 448.
- 3. <u>Authority of City Manager to Prescribe Additional Regulations</u>. The City Manager may adopt such regulations and prescribe such forms as are necessary to implement and collect the fees provided for by this Resolution.
- 4. The fees established by this Resolution are in conformance with previously adopted ordinances, resolutions, agreements, and the City's Municipal Code as they relate to fees and charges.
- 5. Effective Date. The fees for services are effective January 1, 2024.
