

**PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY OF

HONORING OCTOBER 2016

**WHEREAS**, in the city of Wheatland, adults and children are victims of violence each year; and

**WHEREAS**, Wheatland City Council is committed to restoring the right to freedom from fear in our own homes; and

**WHEREAS**, Wheatland City Council is committed to restoring the right to freedom from fear in our communities; and

**WHEREAS**, in our quest to impose sanctions on those who break the law by perpetrating violence, we must also meet the needs of victims of domestic violence and their children who often suffer grave financial, physical, and psychological losses; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that in recognition of the important work done by domestic violence programs, in cooperation with Casa de Esperanza, Inc., I, Jay Pendergraph, Mayor of the City of Wheatland and on behalf of the entire City Council, does hereby proclaim the month of October 2016 as Domestic Violence Awareness Month. We urge all citizens, agencies, and businesses to **WORK TOGETHER AS A TEAM IN OUR COMMUNITY THROUGH PREVENTION, INTERVENTION AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS**, to eliminate domestic violence and become a violence free community.
