

## CITY OF WHEATLAND PROCLAMATION BISHOP BASTIEN OFFICER OF THE YEAR 2021

**WHEREAS**, Bishop was born in Roseville in 1994 and raised in Roseville CA, he attended and graduated Corem-Deo Academy High School in May 2012 and married his sweetheart, Jessica, in August of 2017; and

WHEREAS, Bishop put himself through the police academy attending College of the Redwoods Police Academy, graduating in 2016; prior to his law enforcement career in Wheatland, Bishop worked as a Reserve Police Officer for 3 years for the City of Roseville and the City of Citrus Heights. Bishop graduated from Arizona State University with a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice in May 2019; and

WHEREAS, Bishop was sworn in as a Police Officer at the Wheatland Police Department in November 2019. Bishop is a Field Training Officer and assigned to the Bi-County Regional Officer Involved Shooting Investigation Team. Bishop's hobbies "other than working overtime" include fishing, BBQing and spending time with family and friends; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, Corporal Bastien had a very productive year, leading all officers in total arrests, 135; total DUI arrests, 11; and total citations issued, 97. This is the second year in a row Bishop has led all officers in total arrests, DUI arrests and citations issued; and

WHEREAS, Corporal Bastien's peers describe him as a "go getter, extremely pro-active and someone who spots criminal activity before it occurs."
