**Tire Waste:** Grant funding for tire collection provided by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery. A **maximum of 9** passenger car and light truck tires per person (22" rim diameter or smaller). Tires do not need to be removed from rims.

***Please note:*** State law prohibits persons from transporting more than 9 waste tires at one time without being registered as a waste tire hauler.

**No Hazardous Waste:** examples: paints, solvents, oils, grease, pesticides, asbestos, fluorescent lamps, lead acid batteries, flammable or explosive materials etc.
